Severe Storms Hit West Goshen

September brought an exceptional amount of storm damages to Chester County, as Tropical Storm Isabel and severe rainstorms slammed the region with high winds and excessive rains.

The West Goshen Township government and other service providers responded quickly to keep roads open, power flowing, and government services operating.

Township road crews added overnight shifts to clear roadways of trees and branches, and to empty clogged sewer drains.

PECO worked feverishly to restore energy to the area. Some neighborhoods lacked electricity for up to three days. The West Goshen Municipal Complex, hit by a power outage, was able to stay open with energy supplied by its emergency power generator.

West Goshen Community Day was postponed due to forecasted rains. Because of excessive field saturation for the makeup date, many of the day's activities were held in the Community Park parking lot.

The Township increased its tonnage with trash hauler BFI to accommodate removal of storm debris. For guidelines about disposing of yard waste debris, please refer to the trash listing in the enclosed Residential Waste and Recycling Guide.

Storm Relief Available

President George W. Bush has approved Governor Edward Rendell's request for federal Individual Assistance disaster aid for Chester County as a result of the storms during the week of September 15th. County residents may be eligible for housing assistance, low-interest loans to repair or replace storm-damaged property, or grants for serious needs and necessary expenses not met by other programs. Businesses suffering storm damage may be eligible for Small Business Administration loans.

Residents who suffered storm related damage should call the Federal Emergency Management Agency at I-800-62 I-FEMA. The speech and hearing impaired TTY number is I-800-462-7585. Callers should have the following information handy:

- Telephone number for callback.
- Social Security number.
- Current mailing address.
- Annual gross household income.
- Address of the damaged property.
- Brief description of the damages.
- Insurance information (if property owners have insurance).



Safety Tips from Officer Friendly

Keep your home safe by following these simple guidelines:

- Make sure all entry doors are solid wood (not hollow-core) or metal wherever possible.
- Install and use sturdy deadbolt locks.
- Secure windows on ground levels with appropriate locks.
- · Light all entrances.
- Keep trees and shrubs trimmed.
- Stow ladders, mowers, and garden tools indoors when not using them.
- Mark valuable items in the house with ID numbers.
- Keep valuables out of easy view. Purses, wallets, and holiday gifts should not be readily visible from the door or street. *

Waste & Recycling Guide

his waste and recycling guide contains information about West Goshen Township's residential trash and recycling pick-up. Residential establishments with four or more units and commercial. municipal, and institutional establishments shall contract at their sole cost and expense for the collection of waste and recyclables. Such establishments may select any collector/hauler licensed by West Goshen Township.

Each owner, operator, or administrator of a property which is required to contract with a recycling service must also provide to each occupant,

employee, patron, or resident written material describing its recycling program. Written instructions should clearly describe what materials are to be recycled, how the materials are to be prepared, and how the collection system works.

Recycling containers must be easily accessible and suitable for the type of material that is being collected. Educational facilities should provide for separation and collection of recyclable materials in classrooms, administrative offices, cafeterias, and dormitories.

Required materials for recycling are listed on the following page.

Waste & Recycling Guide

TRASH (Mondays/Thursdays) Maximum of (4) 32 gallon cans per pick-up or its equivalent in trash bags. Place at curbside before 6:00 AM or the night before.

RECYCLE (Mondays) There is no maximum limit. Paper products must be tied or bundled in paper bags. Other items must be placed in a West Goshen Township plastic recycle bucket or a trash can with a Township recycle sticker affixed to it. Recycle stickers are free and may be obtained from the Township. If you have moved into new construction, you may obtain a recycle bucket at no cost at the Township Administration Building. Twenty gallon recycling buckets are available for purchase (\$6 each) at the Township Administration Building. Mark each bucket with your street and house number. Place at curbside before 6:00 AM or the night before.

State law mandates that commercial, municipal, and institutional establishments must provide, at a minimum, for the separation and recycling of white paper (computer paper, letterhead, etc.), corrugated cardboard, and aluminum cans. Residents of houses, apartment buildings, and condominiums must recycle clear glass, aluminum cans, and newsprint. In addition, West Goshen's residential recycling service will accept steel and tin cans, #1 and #2 plastics, clean clear glass jars and bottles, clean colored glass jars and bottles, and mixed papers (junk mail, magazines, telephone books). The Township's residential recycling service can not accept corrugated cardboard, tissues, paper towels and napkins, lids from jars and bottles, plate glass, light bulbs, drinking glasses, or mirrors.

BULK TRASH (1st Thursday of month)

A bulk item is an item which two people can lift. Households are limited to one bulk trash item per month. Refrigerators, air conditioners, and other freon containing items must be tagged that freon has been removed. No building materials, railroad ties, automotive parts, or tires will be picked up. If unsure whether or not your bulk trash item will be collected, call the trash hauler, BFI, at 610-869-2222.

LEAF PICK-UP (November 8 and 22, and

biodegradable bags or trash cans. If using plastic bags, provide a container in which plastic may be left. Trash hauler will not rip open untied bags. Therefore, they could be used again. There is no limit to the number of bags.

Leaves may not be burned, raked into streets, or deposited onto stream beds.

YARD WASTE PICK-UP (2 Saturdays in

the Spring) Yard waste should be tied in bundles with sticks no more than 4' in length and 4" in diameter. Dates for special yard waste collections are listed on the sewer/trash bill and in the Spring Township Newsletter.

NO TRASH SERVICE If a collection day for regular trash, recycling, or bulk pickup falls on a holiday, collection will occur on **the very next day**.

Township trash holidays are:

- New Year's Day
- Memorial Day
- Fourth of July
- Labor Day
- Thanksgiving
- Christmas Day

Recycle Your Holiday Trees

Christmas trees will be accepted at the West Goshen Municipal Complex from January 5-16. Remove all tinsel, decorations, and plastic bags from trees. Wreaths will not be accepted.

If you left your tree for the trash hauler in previous years, consider giving our landfills a break and transporting it to the Municipal Complex to be chipped. A tree removal bag, which may be found at hardware stores, will help contain the needles, making transport easy and clean. Just remember to remove the bag when leaving your tree at the Municipal Complex.
